

# Teaching Multiple Cohorts

## 1. Build the Cohort

Develop a sense of belonging and community within the cohort of students.

### Establish an Identity

Have the cohort create a name and logo for themselves.

### Group Meetings

Meet with the cohort to discuss thoughts, feelings, and experiences.

### Peer Teaching

Encourage students to fill the teacher role and make them responsible for others.

## 2. Design the Experiences

Develop a timeline and plan your course for the entire duration. Develop a single learning goal for each module, and ensure all assignments support the learning goal.

## 3. Focus on Active Learning

Get away from the lectures and encourage the students to do the work. Explain the importance of active learning and how the students will learn more.

### Project-Based

Students explore real-world problems and develop unique solutions.

### Experiential

Hands-on learning with direct experience in the field and reflection.

### Scenario-Based

Students participate in real-world scenarios to apply skills and knowledge.

## 4. Become a Producer

Start recording your lectures, common questions, and common tasks. Stay on target and avoid tangents.

### Microsoft PowerPoint

Use the Slideshow tab to record narration and export as a video and upload.

### Canvas Studio

Use the studio tool to create & upload videos and screen-casts.

### Microsoft Clipchamp

Record and edit videos and screen-casts. Export and upload to Canvas.

## 5. Reflect & Revise

Are the students learning what they are supposed to learn?  
What can I change to make the process easier?

### Microsoft Planner

A visual, card-based planner for tracking tasks.



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
